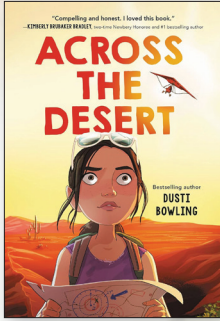

**Dusti Bowling**

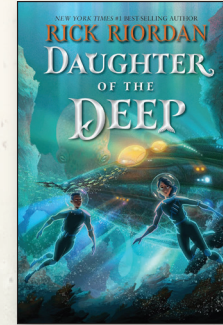

**Rick Riordan**

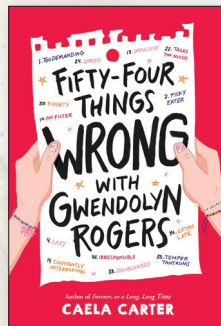

**Sarah Darer Littman**

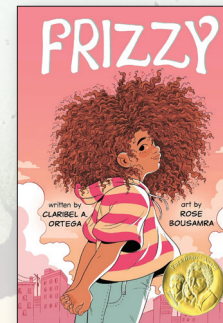

**Claribel A. Ortega**

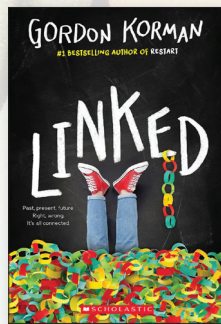
Tired of going to the salon to have her curls straightened every weekend, Marlene slowly learns to embrace her natural curly hair with the help of her best friend and favorite aunt.

**Gordon Korman**

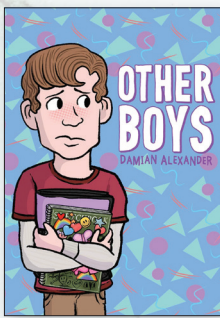
When swastikas begin appearing all over town, Link, Michael, and Dana, the only Jewish girl in town, must face crimes both past and present to find the truth.

**Aisha Saeed**

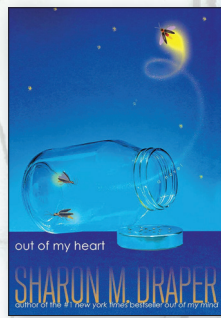
Seventh-grader Omar must contend with being treated like a second-class citizen when he gets a scholarship to an elite boarding school in Pakistan.

**Sharon M. Draper**

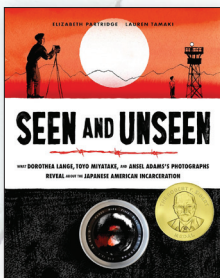
